

DESIGN & IMAGINATION 101

As the old saying goes, *how you start is how you finish!* The planning stage is the most critical and it's the one that is individual to every project. With the right amount of planning you'll be able to design a prop that fits your needs and fits within your space and budget constraints.

YOUR TRAINING NEEDS ASSESSMENT

One of the most common statements heard across the country is that *in our department we do things a little dif-ferent!* Guess what? Stretching a line is stretching a line and every fire department needs to know how to do it successfully. Taking the time to list out the fireground skills and then building those skills into the design of your training program and, ultimately, your training facility is the key to success. We'll perform a training needs assessment so that you get an understanding of what it is and how to do it.

DESIGNING PROPS FOR MAXIMUM VALUE

When it comes to design you really have to match the needs assessment with the realities of *your department's* time, space, and budget. Getting the most out of one or two containers comes from the design stage of the project. What you can do is truly limited to your imagination and creativity and it's the design stage where you begin to realize the full potential of the project.

CONSTRUCTING 101

Once you've got the design nailed down it's time to begin putting the prop together. A single-container prop requires very little to begin training. As the number of props increase you'll find that there really isn't a whole lot of modification that needs to be done to meet the needs developed in the planning stages. You may need local carpenters and/or welders but you may find that you have the talent within the department.





OPERATING BASICS

Operating the prop is simple and involves two things having a solid training plan, and implementing it! We'll review how to set up a training session so that department members are allowed to practice the skills they need to get better at using an environment (prop) that is as close to the real thing as possible.

CONTEXT-BASED TRAINING PROPS

A context-based training prop simply allows you to conduct real-time scenarios that allow all of the skills to take place at the same time. A single-container training prop, designed correctly, will allow you to conduct plenty of context-based training operations. The need for contextbased training cannot be over-emphasized! It's the ability to put-it-all-together that will bring your training, and your department, to the next level.

MAKING IT WORK

High-quality fire department training is something that every department is capable of delivering. The ability to plan, design, and construct a simple training prop that can be used to train department members has been limited more by action than by *ability*! This course will help you realize that realistic fireground training is well within the reach and capabilities of your fire department!
